

HUMAN RIGHTS AND CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Introduction

Ethical business conduct policies of Satocan

Satocan requires that its business be conducted with honesty and integrity, and in accordance with all applicable laws. The company's policies establish clear ethical standards and guidelines on how we do business and establish responsibilities. All associates of the company must abide by the law and comply with the specific standards related to legal obligations, ethics and business conduct. The company has clear accountability mechanisms to monitor and report on compliance with these directives.

Protection of children's rights

Satocan condemns all forms of child exploitation. The company does not recruit child labour and supports the elimination of child labour. Satocan also supports duly enacted laws to prevent and punish the crime of sexually exploiting children. Satocan will work to raise awareness about this exploitation and will cooperate with law enforcement authorities to deal with any cases of exploitation of which the company becomes aware.

Protection of the rights of Satocan employees

We support and defend the elimination of discriminatory practices regarding employment and occupation, and we promote diversity in all aspects of our business operations. Satocan also supports the elimination of all forms of forced labour under conditions of slavery or obligation.
